

Eleventh Lesson – You are beautiful, I love you!

I love you - “Σ’αγαπώ” (Sawapo)
“my love,...” - “Αγάπη μου,...” (Awapie mou)

Although the word “love” in English is used a verb and a noun, in Greek it changes a little. The verb is αγαπώ (awapo) and the noun is αγάπη (awapi)

I love Zakynthos – “Αγαπώ την Ζάκυνθο” - (Awapo tin Zakintho)

I love good food – “Αγαπώ το καλό φαγητό” - (Awapo to kalo fayito)

I love my family – “Αγαπώ την οικογένειά μου” - (Awapo tin ecoyenia mou)

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I like – “Μου αρέσει....” - (μου aresi...)
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Let’s picture it: a few weeks later, summertime, you’re on holidays, having your afternoon drink at the bar, enjoying the relaxing views of the pool, and your other half arrives, dressed up for the evening, so beautiful... what do you say?

You’re very beautiful - “Είσαι πολύ όμορφη” - (ise polie omorfi).

You’re very handsome - “Είσαι πολύ όμορφος” - (ise polie omorfos).
